Samaritan Inns Launches New Residential Treatment Program

WASHINGTON, DC- On **June 16th, 2015** from **2:00pm- 3:00pm**, Samaritan Inns will hold a ribbon cutting ceremony to celebrate the launch of a new residential treatment program, Women with Children, at 1422 Harvard Street NW.

The new Women with Children Program will create a safe home where mothers recovering from substance abuse can receive treatment and family services while establishing a foundation for long-term independent living.

Addicted mothers, along with their dependent children, are one of the greatest underserved populations in the District of Columbia; there are nearly a thousand homeless families, of which half are headed by addicted mothers, and there are thousands more who are at risk of being homeless as a result of substance abuse. With this new program, Samaritan Inns looks to address those needs and build a better future for families who are battling addiction.

The four story row house will provide housing for up to 12 women and 16 children at a time. The row house will include family-style living quarters and individual and group counseling spaces. The detached carriage house will serve as a child care center and administrative offices. All core services will be provided on-site and tailored to meet the unique needs of the family.

Since Samaritan Inns founding in 1985, our mission has been to provide structured housing and recovery services in an environment of support and accountability that give homeless or at risk individuals who suffer from drug and alcohol addictions the opportunity to rebuild their lives. For 30 years, our programs and services have treated and saved more than 10,000 citizens in the District of Columbia. One year after completion of the final phase of the comprehensive program, our graduates report that over 90% are drug/alcohol free, employed full time, and live in their own apartment or home.
